Speakers will provide a COVID-19 update, and then review what is known about the current monkeypox outbreak. Learners will hear how to use the familiar identify, isolate and inform strategy to recognize a case of monkeypox, take appropriate infection prevention measures and engage public health and health systems for follow-up management.
